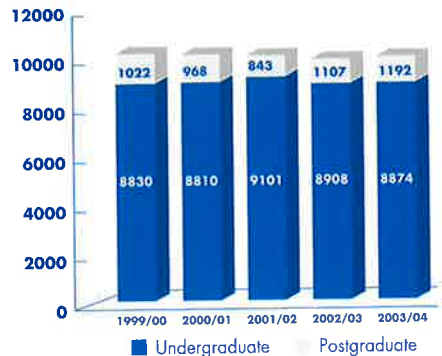

Traditionally at UCN over 71% of full-time undergraduates are under 21 years of age and:

- 98% come from state schools;
- 36% are from Social Class 3M, 4 or 5
- 16% are from Low Participation Neighbourhoods

## Destinations of students graduating in 2002

Each year a 'First Destination' survey is undertaken collecting information from students who have successfully completed full-time first degrees the previous year.

The survey includes graduates from UCN Higher National Diplomas, Diplomas of Higher Education, First Degrees and PGCE courses. The term 'graduate' is used to represent those students successfully completing the above full-time courses at UCN.

By January 2003, 69% of the UCN graduates from 2002 had entered employment and 19% were continuing in training, research and/or further study.

## Research and knowledge transfer facts and figures

- For every pound of core funding (QR), UCN generates more than five pounds from other sources, placing it the sixth best performing HEI in the UK.
- UCN is the fourth best performing HEI in the UK for the amount of PhDs awarded relative to core funding.
- 80 students have successfully completed research degrees, of which 70 are for PhD.
- In 2003 open contracts for research amounted to £2.9 million mainly from UK Research Councils, Government Departments, the EU, industry and major charities
- Professor Christos Kalantaridis received £100,000, from EU Framework 6, for a collaborative project with partners in Poland, Estonia and Bulgaria on the changing geography of production in labour intensive industries.
- Professor Deborah Delaney received £62,000, from the Perrott-Warwick Fund, for a project on parapsychology research.
- Professor Hugh Matthews received three grants: i) £40,000 from the Northamptonshire Partnership, for a project on graduate retention in Northamptonshire; ii) £30,000 from the Welland Partnership, for a project on labour force retention in the region; and iii) £66,000 from the Ordnance Survey, for a project on children's use of maps.
- Dr Margaret Bates received £59,000 from the Northamptonshire Partnership, for projects on wastes management.
- Dr Stephanie Cronin received £38,000 from the Economic and Social Research Council, for a project on popular resistance to elite modernisation in the Middle East: Iran 1921-1941.
- UCN is currently the second most successful UK HEI in its take-up and development of Knowledge Transfer Partnerships.
- The Centre for Children and Youth has topped more than £1 million pounds of income generation since its inception five years ago.
- Matters of Fact Ltd, which is a partnership between UCN and the Northamptonshire Chamber, successfully gained £250k in income generation.

## History

University College Northampton was formed in 1975 through the merger of Northampton's College of Education with the College of Technology and the College of Art & Design. When the Leathersellers College (London) was transferred to Northampton in 1977, University College Northampton became the national centre of education and training for the leather industry. In 1993 the College incorporated the St Andrew's School of Occupational Therapy, and in 1994, the Sir Gordon Roberts College of Nursing and Midwifery. University College Northampton is the only higher education institution in the County of Northamptonshire.

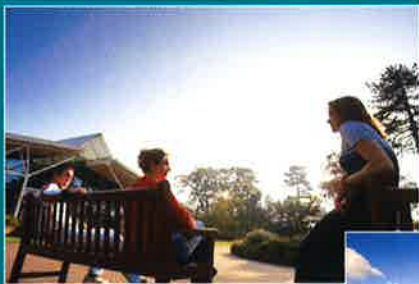
In 1993, the University College was granted Taught Degree awarding powers from the Privy Council.

In 1996, the University College launched the 'University for Northamptonshire' campaign and is actively seeking full university status in the future.

## Estate

The University College is situated on the northern edge of Northampton and has two main sites. The Park Campus is an open campus of approximately 30 hectares. This campus has recently undergone a major redevelopment programme with around £73 million invested in new buildings over the past six years. Park campus includes residential student halls, and specialised teaching areas for science, humanities and social sciences, professions allied to medicine, management and business, including a purpose-built residential management centre and research centre.

The St. George's Avenue Campus is a 10-hectare site, less than two miles from Park Campus and is the major centre for art, design, technology, architecture and the performance arts. Last year, St George's Avenue Campus benefited from £890,000 spent on the refurbishment of teaching facilities and the library.
